Changes to the Quality Assurance - Continuing Education (CE) and Professional Development Program will impact your 2024 Licensure Renewal.

NLCHP Council recently approved CE policy changes that will have an impact on your registration renewal for 2024 – 2025. You will no longer be granted 90 days to complete any outstanding CE requirements. **As a result, you will not be able to renew your practicing/non practicing registration until you have completed and uploaded to the CE portal, all CE requirements for the calendar year 2023.** The revised policy can be viewed on NLCHP's website: [Member Resources](#).

2022 Quality Assurance (QA) Continuing Education Audit: You May Have Been Selected

Registrants selected for the QA audit will receive notification letters in May with a deadline to have all documents submitted to NLCHP by June 16, 2023. Please check your email and mailbox. Participation in the audit is a regulatory requirement and the NLCHP is available to help you at any point in the process, please contact NLCHP if you have questions.

CE Portal

Registrants are reminded that they are required to upload documentation for their CEs as outlined in their College policy. Registrants are able to upload the CEs for 2023 now. Changing Status after Registration Renewal

Registration Renewal for the 2023-2024 registration year has now closed. Inactive Registrants who wish to change their renewal registration status to an active registration must contact the NLCHP by completing a Change of Status Request form found on the NLCHP website: [Registration & Renewal/Change of Status](#).

Fees and Requirements

Registrants who fail to apply to the NLCHP of a change in status and do not renew their registration before the deadline will be required to re-apply for registration. These individuals will be required to meet initial registration requirements including providing a new criminal record and vulnerable sector check and pay a reinstatement fee of \$60.00, in addition to an administrative late fee of \$50.00.
